NEWS OF SCHOOLS EXCHANGE

Following previous successful German Exchanges with the Theodor Storm Schule in Husum, teachers and students at King Charles I School are hoping to relaunch the exchange over the next school year.

We are hoping, in liaison with colleagues at our partner school, to establish an e-pal link between students. This would enable them to practise their language skills, as well as develop friendships, before visiting each other's countries. We envisage in the first instance setting up an email correspondence between students. However, this could also take the form of a more traditional 'pen-pal' exchange by letter.

The staff and students are very enthusiastic about this joint venture because it means that our young people are able to:

- Have a taste of the German/English schooling systems;
- Sample life in a German/English family;
- Raise their awareness of the possibilities of working/living in another EU country;
- Improve their German/English skills.

The experience offered by a week's stay in Germany/England will enrich pupils' lives for many years to come. We also hope that many long-lasting friendships will be formed.
