• Ideal Home Exhibition in Husum

First Commercial Venture

In November, Husum's first Ideal Home Exhibition -'Ambiente 99'attracted 15000 visitors over two and a half days. Wyre Forest businesses shared a stand which took the form of an English House' featuring a living room, a dining room and garden area. Among the businesses were Tomkinsons Carpets, TP Activity Toys, Classic Upholstery, Lockhouse Country Furniture, Arnold Wyer Limited and Sealine International. They were supported by the Economic Development Department of Wyre Forest District Council with a display of information on

the towns of Kidderminster, Bewdley and Stourport and on tourism, business and opportunities for investment in the District.

The Exhibition was visited by a delegation of 8 Charter Trustees headed by the Mayor of Kidderminster, Councillor Lynne Hyde accompanied by her Consort and the Town Clerk, Charles Talbot. The Twinning Association was represented by Ray Harrowing who helped to prepare and man the stand.

The delegation stayed at Hinrichsen Hotel and was generously and hospitably entertained by the new Bürgermeisterin of Husum - Frau Ursula Belker, the Burgervorsteher - Herr Peter Empen, and their Council and Kuratorium colleagues.

The packed programme included a welcome dinner, a Concert by a local Fire Brigade Band, a visit to the weekly market, a morning at the Realschule Nord, (twinned with Harry Cheshire Community High School) where they joined in the English lessons and enjoyed a delicious and beautifully presented lunch prepared by the students; an afternoon evening visiting the Rödemis Spielmannzug Headquarters seeing young musicians aged from 8 to 20 learning and practising; a cold and misty morning at the waste recycling plant; an afternoon touring the Danish School, Scout Centre, Church and Cricket Club; an

evening at an Annual military lecture - 'Global Warming' (yes, in German!) followed by dinner; a morning at the Husum Hospital learning about the very different Health Service provision in Germany; a tour of the Business and Industrial Area and, eventually, to the 'Ambiente' exhibition. Finally, the last day packed in a service in the Church of St George. lunch at Tante Jenny, a visit to the Ship Museum, a drive to Nordstrand for Pharisaers and a Farewell dinner at the Ratskeller. The last few hours the following morning were occupied with breakfast - joined by Frau Belker, a brief tour of the Town Hall and presentation of Husum scarves and ties, an even briefer shopping stop, before the drive to Hamburg and flight to Birmingham unexpectedly via Manchester!

• Kidderminster Valentines Choir....

Inspired by the instant friendship of the Husum Shanty Chor's visit to Kidderminster, when they had sung and partied their way through a whirlwind weekend, August 1999 saw the first visit to Husum by the Valentines Choir. A group of 31 members and a dozen friends/partners stayed either with host families or at Hinrichsens Hotel for the week of Hafentage. They gave a joint Concert with a mixed Husum Choir and the Shanty Chor, sang in the Husum Castle Courtyard and gave various spontaneous concerts!

A group of Dancers and technicians from the Performing Arts Department spent a week in July dancing in Husum, Flensburg and Hamburg. They also ran a dance workshop in Husum. The visit provided the students with practical experience of planning and fundraising a tour.
